General Appearance

The Seco is part of the non-sporting dog group, which makes it a very "mutt-y" looking breed. Usually a medium-sized, muscular dog with a broad face and pointed ears, this dog was made for desert dwelling. Its paws are large in size and its paws have coarse fur between the claws to reduce swelling after walking on rough desert landscapes. The tufts of long soft hair growing from its cheeks, tail and back reduce the harsh sun's burning rays. The long, defined eyelashes on the dog flick grains of sand away from the eyes. The round head is simply an aesthetic choice, making the dog have an awful bashful complexion, matched with the triangle eyes.

Head

Rounded. Roman bridge and triangular eyes. Long eyelashes. Brown eyes, so that the bright sun does not irritate. Long pointed ears for better hearing. Large nose. Teeth and jaw are surprisingly strong.

Neck

Thick, strong and muscular. Longer fur near the back.

Body

Built like the neck, the shoulders are broad and strong, better to climb rocks and steep structures. Lower to the ground than most dogs. Short torso. Built.

Tail

Bushy and covered in soft hair. No longer than a foot, in case of any entrapment issues.

Legs

Strong with fine hair. Large, furred paws.

Coat

The back of the torso and neck, the tail and cheeks have long soft fur to shield the skin from irritation. The rest of the body has short, smooth fur.

Height

18-12 Inches, either sex.

Weight

50-90lbs. A healthy dog is around 75 pounds.

Color

The most common color is a light blonde or tan. Other colors include white or cream. No dark colors, in case of overheating.

Gait

Slow saunter, usually low to the ground. When running, they often break into a whippet-like sprint. Usually walking.

Temperament

Extremely kind and gentle, but not afraid to play rough. Loves to be held and much company. Can be a little rough at times, not good with children. Not easy to anger, but can get dangerous.
